## Dr Michael Callan

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### Summary

Dr Callan is an internationally respected academic in the field of judo. He is the President of the International Association of Judo Researchers, and Education Director of the Commonwealth Judo Association. Author of over 50 books, chapters and articles, he has lectured across the world. He founded the Richard Bowen Archive at the University of Bath, which was nominated for the UNESCO Memory of the World Programme.

A world leader in international judo coach education, he has supported the professional development of around 500 coaches working with national level athletes from over 20 nations. As a coach practitioner, athletes he has worked with have medalled at Olympic, World, European and Commonwealth level.

Founder of the consultancy firm Judospace, Dr Callan has advised a wide range of federations and organisations including the Government of Japan, and the Tokyo 2020 Organising Committee.

Holder of an International Olympic Committee Diploma, and a life member of the British and Maltese Judo Federations, he was awarded the International Judo Federation Special Achievement Award for global contribution to judo education and research.

Thesis title: Elite sport and education support systems.

This work is concerned with how an educational institution developed the sport of judo. Using a case study approach the research establishes the services which educational institutions should offer to optimise the potential of their student athletes. The historical relationship between Kodokan judo and education is explored. The work considers the power within institutions from a conflict theory perspective, and the development of intellectual, moral and physical attributes through judo.

Five themes emerge, that of sustaining, populating, growing, supporting and leading the programme. The thesis finds the value to the University of sustaining a judo programme, is in relation to community and international benefits. A new *jita kyoei* model of a Centre of Excellence in a judo context is proposed. The thesis links the Social Darwinism of Spencer, through the Muscular Christianity of de Coubertin, and the *jita kyoei* of Kano to the twenty first century Team Bath Judo Programme.

1994, I was Head Coach to a British Team from HWJC competing in the Mikihouse Tournament and Sendai Cup in Japan, winning two medals.
