



Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games Tripartite Commission Invitation Places (Wild card invitation places)

Updated 15 August 2020

Judo receives 20 Invitation Places.

The National Olympic Committees (NOCs), not the National Federation, **MUST** make an Invitation Place application to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) **NOT** to the IJF.

All requests submitted from NOCs according to the previous **DEADLINE (2 October 2019 - 17 January 2020)** which have already been analysed by the IJF will remain valid.

YOU CANNOT APPLY FOR ANY NEW ADDITIONAL WILD CARD PLACES.

If necessary, your NOCs may submit an application to change your current athlete to a different one. The **DEADLINE** for NOCs to make a replacement application is **31 January 2021**.

Invitation Places can only be allocated to NOCs with an average of eight (8) or less athletes in individual sports/disciplines at the last two editions of the Olympic Games (London 2012 and Rio 2016) so **ONLY** the following 92 NOCs can apply.

The final allocations will be made in relation to the end of the revised qualification period **(28 June 2021)**.
