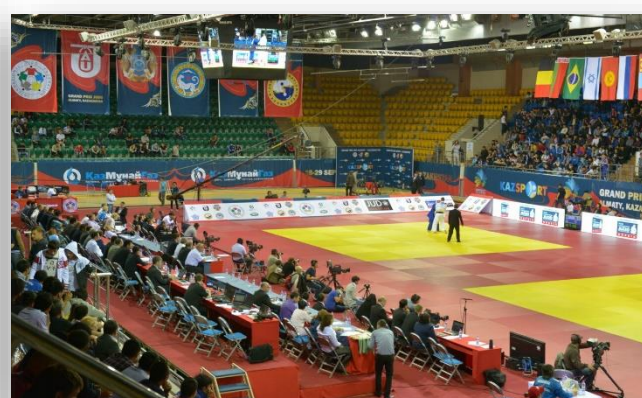

All delegations, who inscribe for an event, must reserve their accommodation in one of the official hotels published in the event outlines. The reservation must be made with the LOC (not directly with the hotel).

Any damage to hotel property resulting from the stay of a National Delegation will be charged to the National Federation and must be paid in full.

Delegations are kindly requested not to dry clothing (including judogi) or have training sessions in the corridors of the official hotels.

Payment

Payment method – Bank transfer or cash (USD)

According to the IJF rule enacted on the 2 December 2012 in Tokyo, "the organising country should not request penalties fee for participating countries who cannot make bank transfers but can pay in cash upon arrival. Those countries who cannot make bank transfers should inform the LOC well in advance that they will pay cash on arrival". All bank fees and bank transfer costs must be paid by the participating National Federation to the following bank:

If payment is being made by bank transfer the bank information must be inserted correctly and completely on the transfer document and any procedures related to amendment of the bank transfer must be done before arrival. Delegations must ensure that all bank charges are paid at their end so that the LOC receive the correct amount of funds without any deductions. Delegation must have proof of the bank transfer, upon arrival.

5. COVID-19 REGULATIONS

Three PCR-tests will be taken from athletes in Almaty - after arrival in the hotel, before weigh-in and departure, which will cost - 60 USD in total.

The officials will be tested only twice - after arrival in the hotel and the departure, which will cost - 50 USD in total.

In case of a positive test result we will follow the Kazakhstan Government/National Public Health Authorities procedure.

Quarantine period: 7 days

Quarantine hotel: Grand Aiser Hotel

Rates: 100 US Dollars single room with full board.

Anyone with a positive test MUST stay in the quarantine hotel provided by the organiser. The cost must be paid by the National Federation.

Payment

Payment method – Bank transfer or cash (USD)

Where to pay - Welcome desk, Accreditation

BEFORE TRAVELLING

Passports must be valid for at least 6 months from the date of arrival.

Check if you need a visa, and if yes, request it from the LOC according to the details in the visa section.

- Book accommodation with the LOC and send a detailed rooming list. Last minute changes can be accommodated whilst the delegation waits on the bus or outside the hotel.

- Check host country entry requirements and airline requirements (if applicable).

Upload in advance to my.ijf.org negative individual medical PCR COVID-19 test certificate(s) in English or local language.

- Upload before arrival to my.ijf.org an individual Liability Release Waiver (LRW).

MINOR ATHLETES

The National Federation is responsible for obtaining legal approval and permission for minor athletes to compete in competitions. When travelling with minors the team official/coach must have all the necessary documents in place that authorises them to act on behalf of the parents/guardians “in loco parentis”.

Minors (under 18) are considered fully vaccinated after completing the first series of vaccination with no end of validity until further decision.

Entry requirement:

If you are FULLY vaccinated or recovered from Covid-19 disease in last 6 months before event:

1 PCR test which is not older than 72 hours before entering the bubble and vaccination certificate or recovery certificate

If you are not vaccinated: two (2) Covid-19 negative individual medical certificates done maximum eight (8) days before entering the bubble and taken at least (minimum) 48 hours apart (can be more than 48 hours).

Please make sure that all documents have also has an English version.

Requirements to enter the host country may differ from the entry requirement of the competition.

During the period when the tests are done you should stay isolated and limit contact with other people as much as possible. If you experience any kind of symptoms do not start to travel (even with two negative PCR tests).

PCR tests, Vaccination Certificate/Recovery Certificate, Liability Release Waiver must be uploaded to the platform my.ijf.org by NF administrator well in advance before the arrival of the delegation members. **In case of problems with accessing the database, please, write to registration@ijf.org.**

ENTERING THE EVENT BUBBLE WHICH IS OPEN FROM: 11 May 2022

The event venues (hotels, sport hall, training hall etc.) will be classified as bubbles and to reduce risk a “bubble to bubble” concept will be used. People are NOT allowed to leave their bubble as contamination could occur endangering the safety of the event and the health of the participants. Each individual is responsible to ensure they follow the IJF COVID rules for entry to the bubble.

DURING THE EVENT

- Wash/sanitise your hands regularly.
- Competitors should wash and disinfect their hands and feet regularly.
- No handshake greets each other with a bow.
- Always wear a mask. Exceptions: masks are not obligatory on the Field of Play tatami, in the coach box, on the warm-up tatami whilst warming up or on the training tatami whilst training, or while eating in designated dining areas.
- Maintain 1.5 m distance at all times, except for competitors during training, their contests and during warming up with ONE PARTNER.

Submit yourselves to contactless temperature measurement. Anyone registering a high temperature will be asked to remain outside and their Delegation COVID-19 Manager, the LOC COVID-19 Manager will be contacted. An opportunity to recheck their temperature will be given, if it is still high a final decision will be made by the LOC COVID-19 Manager.

SYMPTOMS AFTER ARRIVAL

Anyone who experiences symptoms after arrival must immediately contact their Delegation COVID-19 Manager who will then contact the LOC COVID-19 Manager (see at LOC Event Contacts).

6. TRANSPORTATION

The Organizer will provide land transportation from Almaty International Airport or Almaty Train Station to the official hotels and back. During the competitions, transportation will be provided between the venue and the hotel ONLY to accredited delegations.

9. INSURANCE

Each National Federation is responsible for its competitors (the control of non-pregnancy as well as the gender control are placed under the responsibility of the National Federations) and must assume all responsibility for accident and health insurance as well as the civil liabilities for their competitors and officials, during the Competition.

The organizer and JUA will not be responsible for any insurance related to the above mentioned matters. Nevertheless, the National Judo Federation staging the competitions shall take all necessary actions to provide insurance coverage against civil liability for the entire duration.

10. DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS

Visa Entry: 20 April, 2022

First Entry (entry by number): 10 April, 2022

Travel information: 25 April, 2022

Final Entry (judobase.org) 25 April, 2022

11. PARTICIPATION

All the participants must have valid IJF ID card, otherwise registration for this event is not possible. This JUA Cup Juniors is open for all JUA/IJF Member Federations. There is no limit in the number of participation for each weight category for every federation. The competitors must be of the same nationality as the National Federation, which enters them. In case a Federation or a club registers an athlete with a different Nationality, a confirmation letter from the National Federation of the country of which the athlete holds the passport should be presented during the accreditation.

12. COMPETITION RULES

Competition will be conducted in accordance with the IJF and JUA Sports and Organization Rules, and IJF Refereeing Rules.

Men & Women – Four (4) minutes (Real Time)

The “Golden score” with no time limit. Referee’s decision is cancelled.

13. REFEREES

Each participating countries may enter TWO (2) referees at maximum. Referees must have IJF International or Continental Referee License.

14. WEIGH-IN

Official weigh-in for each weight category is held the evening before the competition day (see program). Athletes must present accreditation card, IJF ID card and his/her passport (National ID Card showing nationality and date of birth are also accepted).

15. DRAW

The draw will be conducted online at 17:00 on 12 May in Baluan Sholak Sport Palace. Each National Federation must send a delegate to attend the Draw, a maximum of two (2) delegates per National Federation (2 officials) will be authorized.

16. JUDO GI

Approved Judogi

All Judoka must compete in IJF Approved Judogi. Judogi Control

It will be operated with a Sokuteiki prior to the fight. Judogi must have an IJF Official Label "APPROVED JUDO GI" with an optical code which cannot be falsified. The label can be controlled with an optical lamp. Each of the competition clothing articles (jacket, trousers and belt) must have an IJF official label.

National Emblem

Athletes can have their national emblem on the left front part of the jacket within a space of 100 cm².

17. COACHING

Code of behavior of coaches as defined in the Sports and Organization Rules, Annex 4 will be strictly observed, inclusive the Dress Code.

Coaches are not allowed to give indications to the competitors while they are fighting.

Only during the pause time (after matte), coaches will be permitted to give indications to their athletes. - After the pause is finished, and the fight continues (hajime), coaches will have to keep silent again.

If a coach doesn't follow these rules, they can be expelled from the competition area.

If the coach persists with this behavior from outside the competition area, they could be penalized.

18. AWARDS AND PRIZES

1st Place – Gold Medal with Diploma

2nd Place – Silver Medal with Diploma

3rd Place – Bronze Medal with Diploma

19. VISA

The Organizer is happy to help any country with obtaining visa for athletes and officials.
