In Paris, the IOC is launching a unique project to provide athletes with **professional headshot photos**. These photos will be available via the Athlete365 app, and will appear on public scoreboards, screens, TV graphics, websites and social media. Additionally, a **name-recording session** will ensure sports presentation venue announcers and TV and radio hosts pronounce athletes' names correctly.

This initiative will highlight athletes and their teams, enhancing the Olympic experience for everyone, whether in the venues or watching at home.

Please come in your **white judogi and belt**.

From Monday **22 July** to Thursday **25 July**, from **08:00** to **22:00**.

at **the Olympic Village** – IOC Headshot Studio (Bastille Services Centre building, 1st floor)

On site, a team of two people, a photographer and a coordinator, will assist you and manage the session that will last around 5 minutes.

To feature and air the photos at competition venues, on TV and in the media, the IOC needs you to do the photo shoot **48 hours before your first competition**.

Session process:

1. **Positioning** – You will be guided to stand in the designated area marked on the floor.
2. **Accreditation Photo** – We will take a photo of you holding your accreditation next to your face.
3. **Portrait Photo** – We will take a portrait photo of you facing the camera.
4. **Celebration Photo** – We will capture a celebration/fun photo of you.
5. **Your name** will be recorded in the order it appears on the accreditation.

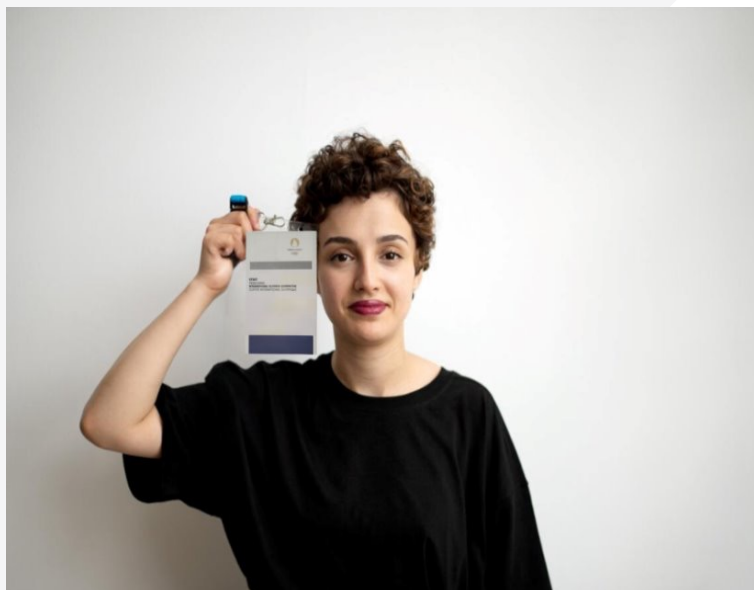
