Paris 2024 Olympic Games



The Olympic qualification process began in June 2022 and concluded in June 2024.

The Paris 2024 Olympic Games were a success:

- Universality of judo ranked as the 3rd highest Olympic sport in terms of participating nations and its gender-equal qualification system.
- 19 teams in the mixed team competition, including a refugee team that continues to receive strong support from the IJF.

Medals were awarded to athletes from **26 different nations**, highlighting judo's global appeal and inclusivity.

World Ranking



 On the World Ranking List (WRL), we have 10291 judoka from 177 nations, all of whom are eligible to compete in events through the 2025-2028 Olympic cycle.

• We will continue the **IJF refugee project** with the goal of refugee athletes participating in the 2028 Los Angeles (LA) Olympic Games.























Olympic Cycle 2025-2028



- The qualification period will last two years, beginning in June 2026 and ending in June 2028.
- The **six (6) best results** from each Olympic Games qualification period (50% / 100%) will be counted.
- The Olympic qualification process will end with the 2028 World Championships.
- The **host nation** of the **senior world championships** is allowed wild cards, which do not affect their federation quota (this rule is already in place for junior and cadet world championships).
- Eight (8) mixed teams will be seeded in IJF events, including the Olympic Games.
